PAT GUARD



Friday evening from 4:30 pm-7 pm during dinner service.





Big Mouth Bingo Rules:

- 1. You MUST have your Moose ID Card out in front of you to be dealt cards.
- You must present both your ID/Driver's License and Moose Membership Card to claim a prize.
- 3. Should a person without a Moose ID and/ or Driver's License get a bingo:
- a. They will be disqualified from that hand and from playing at all until both their Moose ID and Driver's License are on their person.
- b. The pot for such a hand will be rolled over to the next hand.
- c. If this happens on the last hand of the day, the pot in question will be donated to the Moose Charities Endowment Fund.
- d. Using another person's Moose ID card is not allowed and against the rules. Doing so can result in loss of privilege to play Big Mouth Bingo.
