ADMINISTRATORS MESSAGE

Michelle Kay

A Year in Review: Celebrating Milestones and Looking Forward

Can you believe it's already been a year? April 1, 2025, marks my one-year anniversary with Peninsula Moose Lodge 2362, and what a year it has been! I wanted to take this opportunity to reflect on the many accomplishments we've achieved together, and to thank all of you for your continued support and dedication to our lodge.

The past year has been incredibly successful, and it wouldn't have been possible without the help and collaboration of our 2024-25 Board of Officers. We've worked tirelessly to ensure the financial health and growth of our lodge, and I am proud to share some of the highlights:

IRS Penalties Waived: We successfully obtained waivers for the 2022 and 2023 IRS penalties for filing 990s late, saving the lodge just over \$10,738.

Tax Compliance: We got caught up on our PFML and Employment Security taxes, ensuring that reports were filed and payments were made.

Timely Filing: We filed our 2024 IRS 990 return, our various state, and local tax forms, and paid any taxes due on time, keeping us compliant and organized.

Updated Policies: We revised and implemented a new vacation policy to better serve our members and staff.

Membership Growth: We've welcomed 305 new members as of March 19, 2025, and achieved overall membership growth of approximately 100 members, thanks to new memberships, transfers, re-enrolls.

Facility Improvements: We replaced the two non-operational heating systems on the north side of the lodge, restored the walk-in cooler by replacing its evaporator, and completed the new storage shed. We also improved our parking lot, and worked on the grass outside to get the goat-heads removed.

Lodge 2362 Pride: We designed and brought in new Lodge 2362 merchandise so we can all show our lodge pride. Available merchandise includes fleece jackets, hoodies, three styles of T-shirts, hats, mugs, lodge stickers and lodge license plates.

Upgraded Systems: We implemented a new payroll system that saves us \$35 per month and is more efficient for what we need, upgraded our Point of Sale System to accept credit cards in the social quarters, enhanced our security system, upgraded the lodge PA System, replaced the failing exhaust fan above the kitchen and revamped the lodge's network and wireless infrastructure.

Improvements to existing Activities: We heard your feedback and implemented a Queen of Hearts board, where all 52 cards can be hung on display in the lodge.

We also bought new card shufflers to make it simpler and more streamlined for the volunteers who call and deal for Big Mouth Bingo. And, last but not least, we switched up the selection of prizes for our bottle raffles to include items frequently requested, doing away with the ones we heard nobody wants.

New Activities and Committees: We introduced monthly music nights, Big Mouth Bingo on Thursdays, and Crafting Sundays, with all net proceeds going to our Endowment Fund. We also appointed two new chairs for the Volunteer and Maintenance Committees to strengthen our operations.

Breakfast Service: We began serving breakfast at the lodge five days a week, offering members a delicious way to start their day. None of these achievements would have been possible without the hard work and dedication of everyone involved. I'm truly grateful to the Board of Officers, our volunteers, and each of you, our members, for your unwavering support.

As April 2025 is the last month on the board for some of our current officers, please reach out to them and thank them for their hard work and dedication. They are all truly amazing! I am looking forward to working with the new board in May 2025.

As we look ahead, I encourage you to continue sharing your ideas and feedback with me. I'm always open to hearing what you'd like to see at the lodge, whether it's new activities, improvements, or ways to make your experience even better.

Thank you once again for a fantastic year—let's make the next one even better!

WSNIMA Mid-Year Conference

The Washington State and Northern Idaho Moose Association (WSNIMA) Mid-Year Conference was held in Pasco, WA from March 6th through 9th, 2025. Our lodge representatives, Chuck Bryan (President) and Michelle Kay (Administrator), attended this conference, and they brought back some valuable insights that will help our lodge move forward.

Chuck attended the Membership breakout session and found it to be incredibly useful. One standout suggestion from Moose International (MI) and other lodges was the idea of hosting dart board tournaments as a way to attract new members. This fun and engaging activity has proven to be an effective membership-building strategy.

In addition, Chuck shared that there is a strong push from both MI and the WSNIMA board of officers for all lodges to regularly conduct 9 O'Clock ceremonies. These ceremonies help foster unity and strengthen the connection between members.

Michelle attended the Administrator Breakout sessions, which she found extremely helpful. One key takeaway was that all lodge administrators are facing similar challenges when it comes to managing day-to-day operations. Additionally, questions about Special Meeting ceremonies were clarified—there is no formal ceremony or prayer; it's simply the business of the special meeting that takes place.

Michelle also had the opportunity to spend time with Jean Gaverth during the conference, and together they were able to resolve the majority of the QBO (QuickBooks Online) issues. While most issues have been addressed, there are still some outstanding checks and unpaid bills that Michelle will need to research further to clean up.

Chuck also participated in discussions about our success with the Bar Bingo games and how popular they have been. In the same session, they brainstormed about having themed events and the proper procedure for the election process.

Lastly, but not least, our own Otto Hill won \$300 in the Community Chest membership campaign run by WSNIMA! The check has already been delivered to Otto, and we congratulate him on this exciting win. The new WSNIMA Membership Campaign is underway – a Bonanza of Gift Cards. A poster with details of this campaign is posted in the main hallway in the lodge. The conference was a great success, and we look forward to implementing these new ideas and continuing to improve our lodge operations.

Heart Of The Community Scholarships

Since 1986, the Moose Fraternity has awarded scholarships to deserving students, recognizing their academic efforts and extracurricular efforts as well as honoring the lodges to which these students are affiliated.

Applications for the 2026 Heart of the Community scholarships are now being accepted, with a deadline of June 30, 2025. Applicants must be members of the graduating class of 2026; must have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a current member of the Moose; and must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent verified by a copy of the student's transcript. Meeting these criteria qualifies a student for a chance to win a \$1,000 scholarship.

If the student is involved in in-school or extracurricular activities or if the student is involved in various out of school activities, the student qualifies for a chance to win a \$5,000 scholarship.

Big Mouth Bingo Rules:
